(2) Japanese language course orientation

If you take Japanese language classes at Yamaguchi University for the first time, please attend the following Japanese language orientation.

(3) How to enroll Japanese classes

- ① If you have *never* studied Japanese before, please take ‘Japanese I’ and/or ‘Survival Japanese’.
- ② If you have taken Japanese classes at Yamaguchi University before, please go to the same level class as the previous semester. However, those who have passed Japanese 1 and Japanese 2 should go to the higher level class.
- ③ If you are going to take Japanese classes at Yamaguchi University *for the first time*, please take the courses of the level according to your score result of YU-JTEST that you took when you applied for the exchange program at Yamaguchi University. If you have never taken YU-JTEST, please come to the following date and time to take the test.

The time required to complete the test is approximately 1 hour.

(4) How to register for Japanese classes

① Undergraduate students, Exchange students

② Graduate Students

Please write an E-mail to the instructor in charge of the class you wish to take and apply for the status of “*Credited Auditors*”. If you meet all task requirements for the classes, you will be awarded credits and credit certificates. An example of how to fill out the application form can be found on the next page.

Application Deadline: April 17th Wed.

Place of submission: Academic Affairs Section of your graduate school

Important notice

- Credits for Japanese subjects are NOT considered required credits for graduation for graduate students.
- For the application for the status of “Credited Auditors”, you need permission from your supervisor.
- The application form must include the seals of your supervisor and the instructor in charge of the class. Please bring the application form to class the first week.

③ Research Students

Contact by e-mail the instructor in charge of the class you wish to take to let her know that you would like to take a class.

In the e-mail, write (1) your name, (2) student number, (3) affiliation, (4) the result of YU-JTEST and (5) the name of the class you would like to take.

3	JLPT	Have passed the N4 exam and aim to study for the N3 exam
	Can-do	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ You understand when people speak slowly and simply, but regular speed conversations are hard to understand ➤ You can understand the main points in an explanation of class topics, schedules and procedures ➤ You can read 200~300 kanji ➤ You can read and write short sentences about your hobbies, families, and other familiar topics
4	JLPT	Have passed the N3 exam and aim to study for the N2 exam
	Can-do	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ You can have a long conversation about topics you are interested in ➤ You can understand moderate length conversations about common topics if the speaker uses standard Japanese ➤ You can generally handle situations that come up in everyday life in Japan ➤ With help from a dictionary, you can read a book about familiar topics ➤ You can write a moderate length essay about topics you are interested in and can use about 500 kanji
5	JLPT	Have passed the N2 exam and aim to study for the N1 exam
	Can-do	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ In a comfortable situation, you can participate actively and fluently in a conversation with a native speaker about familiar topics ➤ Using a dictionary, you can more or less understand a university lecture with technical words, write essays, and make presentations ➤ Using a dictionary, you can write a detailed paper about familiar topics and can use 800-1000 kanji

Important notes

- Each integrated course (I~IV) have more than two classes in a week. You need to attend all the classes of the subject, not separately.
- ‘Japanese through Project Work’ is recommend for Level 3 students.
- ‘Japanese Studies I’ is suitable for Level 4 students and ‘Japanese Studies II’ is for Level 5 students.
- ‘Business Japanese’ is suitable for Level 5 students, but Level 4 students also can take this class.
- Japanese IV is divided into two classes, one is a class for students of FGSS (Faculty of Global and Science Studies) and the other is a class for students of other faculties but FGSS. Please take the class for your faculty.
- Class instructors may suggest students to move to a different class level according to their language skills.
- Attendance is compulsory. Students who miss more than 3 times in a single subject in an academic semester will not get credits for that subject.
